Application Steps

The Resilient SRQ Housing Recovery Program aims to restore a homeowner's primary residence to a decent, safe, and sanitary condition, improve resiliency, and, where necessary, reconstruct properties when repairs are not feasible.

1. Complete Full Application

Homeowners who have completed the interest survey and meet the basic pre-qualifications will be invited to submit a more in-depth application. This application will require supporting documentation to verify eligibility, including (but not limited to):

- Identification
- Income verification
- Home ownership verification
- Damage verification

2. Verify Eligibility

After collecting the application and supporting documentation, staff will review the information to determine eligibility for assistance. A case manager will be assigned to assist the applicant for the duration of the project.

3. Conduct Assessment and Inspection

Applicants will be scheduled for a damage assessment and an environmental review of their damaged property. A duplication of benefits assessment will be conducted at this time.

4. Report Estimated Cost of Repair

After completing the damage assessment, a report will be generated outlining the estimated cost of repair and the scope of work required.

5. Determine Award Allocation

The award amount will be determined based on the results of the duplication of benefits worksheet and the estimated cost of repair report.

6. Execute Award Agreement

Once the program issues the award agreement to the applicant, the applicant will review and execute the agreement.

7a. Repair or Reconstruct

Once the award agreement is executed, the repair, rebuild or replacement process will begin. The program will pay the contractor directly for eligible activities.

7b. Reimburse

For reimbursement requests for work completed from Hurricane Ian, funds will be distributed to the homeowner.

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
